NEW TEAM FOR DURHAM

James Peter Croft

28 March 1943 - 3 June 2018

So it was when the Provincial Grand Secretary reported the death of James Peter Croft to the Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham Mark Masons, to Lodges throughout the Province, Grand Mark Lodge and all its Districts.

Since that announcement many lodge members have demonstrated their sympathy in the usual Masonic manner. The sign of reverence being an outward display but we also use those moments to remember that person and reflect upon their contribution and personal attachments.

On Wednesday the 27th of June 2018, at the Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham Mark Masons AGM, similar sentiments will be honoured following the tributes and observations of the Provincial Grand Master to departed merit

Many members within the Mark Degree may not have had the privilege of knowing Peter, and what follows are the personal reflections of several brethren who were privileged to know him both as a colleague and friend:



Fred Richardson

Peter was tireless in his attachment to the cause of Mark Masonry. He would respond at any time to requests from Mark Lodges to visit them, giving

willingly and unconditionally of his time and energy. He was an inveterate visitor to other Mark Provinces, too, and always "flying the flag" of Mark Masonry in the Province of Durham. One of his particular objectives was to have the Mark seen as an Order which

innovated procedures which he would be delighted for others to copy. He was very keen on the wives/partners of members being part of the total picture and encouraged their inclusion wherever possible.



William (Bill) Swift

I was fortunate to be appointed as Provincial Grand Secretary in 1994, which followed Peter's year as Secretary before his appointment as the Assistant

Provincial Grand Master. A year later being installed as the Provincial Grand Master. I remember with fondness, accompanying him on countless Provincial Deputation Visits to Mark Lodges throughout the Province. The thousands of miles we covered representing the Provincial Grand Mark Lodge of Durham to all parts of the country, visiting just about every Province and Grand Mark Lodge. Many of which were in the company of my wife Lynne. We have many great memories of those trips. He was tireless in promoting the Mark Degree in general but the Province of Durham in particular. He was generous, a fellow mason and importantly a friend who we will miss but fondly remember.

Peter Croft was an inspiration to many within the Masonic Provincial of Durham, and many more in the wider field.

He held very senior positions in most of the Orders of Free Masonry and his Masonic knowledge was phenomenal.

He will be deeply missed by the Province in general and passionately missed by those who knew him. Rest in Peace Peter.

He spoke as he found but not with malice. A small man in stature but one with an enormously generous heart. He proved an excellent Leader for the Mark Province of Durham and one who's passing will be very much regretted.

I was an acting Provincial Officer for almost 20 years while Rt.W.Bro. James Peter Croft was our Provincial Grand

Master. During that period, he worked tirelessly with enthusiasm and dedication to promote the Province of Durham. Under his leadership the quality of the ceremonial aspect of the order has improved considerably.

He was held in very high regard by Mark Grand Lodge and his appointment to the General Board and the Grand Masters Royal Ark Council speaks volumes.

He had a huge impact on my own masonic career and I always found his knowledge and guidance invaluable.

All these sentiments are tributes associated to an outstanding individual, accomplished leader.


His proposer was W Bro. George Paylor the Provincial Senior Warden and seconded by W Bro. Sid Watson, Provincial Assistant DC.

Andy McGill is a volunteer Lifeboat Crew member and Deputy Lifeboat Press Officer based in the North East at the Sunderland Life Boat station. Andy has always been active in sailing activities of the Sunderland Yacht Club and one day was asked if he would be interested in joining the Lifeboat Centre as a crew member. He decided to take up this challenge and found it very rewarding but time consuming and has to balance the time between his day job and the R.N.L.I. He loves his new found role as a Lifeboat crew member and the intensive training they each have to complete for this very skill full job and the high standards to achieve and maintain. Andy was invited by the WM of the Unity Lodge of MMM no. 827 to give a talk

explaining the tremendous work the R.N.L.I. carries out all the year round. Although this was the very first presentation of this talk by Andy without a supervisor he took to it as the proverbial duck to water. He explained that the Lifeboat service is not classified as an emergency service and cannot therefore use the blue emergency lights. It is a charity and depends entirely on

donations to be able to save lives at sea and increasingly also in the education of safety on water. Prevention becoming as important as rescue. In an emergency the crews are called up by the coast guard with a pager which provides them with the information about the location and conditions of the area where the problem has been reported. The modern suits are a far cry from the ones the service had to use in the past. They now have dry suits with buoyancy aids and inflatable life jackets which allow for up to five people to cling on to without drowning. Even the boots are specially designed with smear proof soles to prevent making any marks on the decks of expensive yachts!

When Andy was asked how many persons could be rescued he replied that the crews will take "All of them " - never leave anyone behind.

If needed backup would be called until every one was rescued. The brethren really enjoyed the clear and precise way Andy explained the many details and history of the Life boat service in the North East and showed their appreciation with warm applause and generously donated the collection of $\mathfrak L$ 200 to the R.N.L.I. with a sincere thanks to Andy for the way he represented the service he is so proud of.

Many of the Brethren may have heard of this organisation as both the Craft and MBF have donated considerable amounts of money to help with projects in various parts of the world.

Nipuni is thirteen years old and she lives in a very rural part of Sri Lanka. Her home is in the jungle area and some distance from any real civilisation. However with the help of PLAN UK she is able to attend school regularly and hopes to eventually go into higher education. Every sponsor and child, write letters to each other and send photographs and drawings. This helps to form a bond between the child, their parents and the sponsor.

W/Bro Harrison has previously travelled to Cairo to

visit another of his sponsored children, Mohamed and hopes to travel at some time in the future, to Varanasi in North East India to visit his third sponsored child Heena.


