Peter was initiated as a Lewis into the Marquess of Ripon Craft Lodge on 14th March 1957, and will be celebrating 60 years in the Craft next month, another wonderful achievement. He was Master in 1971, awarded Provincial Rank of PPrGReg in 1981 and promoted to PPrGJW in 2011.

He was exalted into Darlington Royal Arch Chapter 1978, was Z in 1993 and The Chapter Scribe E from 1999 - 2003. He was awarded PPrGReg in 1998, and promoted to PPrGSN in 2004.

Peter was advanced into Steadfast Mark Lodge No.846 on 1st February 1967 and has therefore completed 50 years service to the day. He was Master in 1982, was awarded Provincial Rank of PrGReg 1987, Promoted to PPrGJW in 1990 and PAGDC in 1997. An excellent and fine Masonic Career of which WBro.Peter W.Smailes, PAGDC, PPrGJW, can be justly proud, and is now properly commemorated with the presentation of his 50 years Certificate.
