PROVINCIAL GRAND LODGE OF MARK MASTER MASONS OF DURHAM 2020 VIRTUAL ANNUAL MEETING

The 100th Annual Meeting of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham was due to be held in the Lancastrian Suite, Lancaster Road, Dunston, on Wednesday, 24th June 2020. However, due to the Covid 19 Pandemic, it had to be cancelled, and was replaced by a Virtual Meeting, held on ZOOM, on Wednesday 29th July 2020 at 7pm.

The Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro Prof. Denovan Keith Wilson presided.

In addition, 46 Durham Brethren tuned in to the meeting. Apologies were received from 10 other Worshipful Brethren and Brethren.

1. The Provincial Grand Master declared the meeting 'Open' at 7pm.

2. The Provincial Grand Secretary read the letter of Exemption from the Notice of General Suspension issued on 17th March 2020, and the subsequent letter received following the lifting of the suspension on July 17th.

The Provincial Grand Master welcomed the other Heads of Order to the meeting. He then welcomed R.W. Bro Gordon Craigs (PGM for Northumberland). He congratulated R.W.Bro. Craigs on his tenure of the Office, which is due to end in September, and thanked him for the friendship and rapport between the 2 Provinces. He then announced, and congratulated R.W. Bro. Craigs on his future appointment as APGM in the Craft in the Province of Northumberland.

3. Minutes

The Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham held at Dunston on Wednesday, 26th June 2019, which had been circulated via Lodge Secretaries, and published on the Provincial Website, were taken as read, confirmed, and signed on the proposal of the Provincial Grand Senior Warden, W.Bro. M.J. Gilpin, and seconded by the Provincial Grand Junior Warden, W.Bro. J.S. Denham.

4. Provincial Grand Secretary's Report

The Provincial Grand Secretary's Report, which had been circulated via Lodge Secretaries, and had been published on the Provincial Website, was taken as read, confirmed, and adopted on the proposal of the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. D.N. Hanson P.A.G.D.C., and seconded by the Assistant Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. R.T. Lynn P.A.G.D.C. (Copy of the Report printed below).

5. Election of Treasurer

There being only one nomination received for the office of Provincial Grand Treasurer, the Provincial Grand Master declared W.Bro. Graham John Mitchinson P.G.J.D., Past Master of Percy Lodge No. 122, duly elected. W.Bro. Mitchinson had been proposed by W.Bro. D.N. Hanson Dep.P.G.M., P.A.G.D.C., and seconded by W.Bro. R.T. Lynn Asst.P.G.M., P.A.G.D.C.

6. Provincial Grand Treasurer's Report

The Provincial Grand Treasurer's Report had been circulated via Lodge Secretaries, and had been published on the Provincial Website. (Copy of the Report, and the accompanying financial statements printed below). The Provincial Grand Treasurer went to great lengths to remind Brethren that, at the 2019 Annual Meeting, he had given Notice of Motion to increase annual subscription rates. Accordingly, his Report contained a Proposal to increase the subscription rate for members of MARK Lodges by £1 per head (from £3-50 to £4-50 per Lodge member), and to increase the subscription rate for RAM LODGES from £5 per Lodge, to £10 per Lodge. He made it very clear that by accepting his Report, the members would be voting

through the proposed increases effective from 1st January 2021. The Deputy Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. G. Wharton P.A.G.D.C. then proposed, and the Assistant Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. D. Quickmire P.G.J.D. seconded the proposition, that the Treasurer's Report and Statement of Accounts be received, and adopted, and that the thanks of Provincial Grand Lodge be accorded to the Treasurer and to the Auditors for their services. This proposal was carried, thereby voting through the proposed increases in subscriptions.

7. Election of Auditors

The Deputy Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. G. Wharton P.A.G.D.C. proposed, and the Assistant Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. D. Quickmire P.G.J.D. seconded the proposition, that Torgersens (formerly: UHY Torgersens) Chartered Accountants, of Somerford Buildings, Norfolk Street, Sunderland be elected Auditors for the ensuing year. This proposal was carried.

8. Report of Benevolent Committee

As the Report and accompanying Accounts had been circulated via Lodge Secretaries, and had been published on the Provincial Website, and as it had earlier been approved for submission to Provincial Grand Lodge by the committee of the DPGLMBF on 21st July 2020, W.Bro. D.N. Hanson P.A.G.D.C., Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Chairman of the Benevolent Committee, commended his Report to the Brethren. (See accompanying Report and Accounts below). The Provincial Grand Master thanked the members of the Committee of the Durham PGLMBF, and all the Lodge Benevolent Representatives for their efforts and hard work during the year.

9. Appointment of Officers

The Provincial Grand Master then confirmed that, although no investiture was to take place at a Virtual Meeting, the Appointments and Promotions listed below were effective as of the 24th June 2000. (See accompanying list below).

10. PGM's nominations to serve on the Durham PGLMBF

The Provincial Grand Master announced that he had invited V.W.Bro Stuart Andrew Raymond Ingram P.Asst.P.G.M., P.G.J.O., and V.W.Bro. Keith Liddell P.G.J.O. to serve on the above committee for 2020-2021, and that they had both accepted.

11. Provincial Grand Master's Address

The Provincial Grand Master then addressed the Meeting. He reported that 28 Brethren had departed to the Grand Lodge Above since our last Annual Meeting, and requested a few moments of reflection in memory of them. He congratulated the 5 newly appointed members of Grand Lodge, and the 3 Brethren receiving promotions in September. He then went on to thank the Provincial Grand Secretary and his team for their hard work during the difficult times of the pandemic. Finally, he commented on the opportunity to celebrate our Centenary in June, which had to be cancelled – pointing out that the past is history, the future is a mystery, and the here and now is a gift, which is why it is called the present - which we should cherish. In summary, we stand at the dawn of a new century for the Mark Province of Durham. We must learn the lessons of the past, apply them to the present, so that whatever the future might hold for us, we can be better prepared to meet it, and shape it to how we want the future to be. This can be our vision, and making it a reality should be our mission.

12. Any other business

Report of the Provincial Grand Secretary to Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham which was due to be held at the Lancastrian Suite, Lancaster Road, Dunston, Gateshead NE11 9JR on Wednesday, 24th June 2020.

Brethren, I present my second Report to the Mark Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham. As you will see from the items listed below, the last year has been extremely busy and enjoyable, but ultimately very disappointing. It began in a euphoria of excitement, exuberance, and anticipation of the celebration of our Centenary Year. There was a great energy about the Province. There was great energy being expended in organising the Centenary Dinner, and planning for the Centenary Meeting of the Mark Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham on 24th June 2020. Alas, it was not to be. Towards the end of 2019, we began to hear news of the Corona Virus emanating from China (or Covid 19 as it soon became known). Very soon it was evident that is was more than a mere 'dose of flu', and by the middle of March 2020, all Masonic meetings had been suspended for 4 months – something that had never happened in over 300 years of Freemasonry. Brethren, as I write this report, our Centenary events are all postponed. I hope we will be able to hold them at some time in the future, but I cannot begin to give you any idea as to when that might be. At this point in time, all I can say is that the general administration of the Province continues to the normal set deadlines, and I am relying on the various Lodge Secretaries to assist me in those matters. I look forward to seeing you all in the future – let us hope, sooner rather than later. Until then, stay safe, and I wish you all well.

Installations.

The Provincial Grand Master was represented at all the Mark Lodge Installation Meetings and the reports of those representing indicated that the Ceremonies were, as usual, of a high standard, and well conducted in the majority of cases. Thanks are extended to all those Brethren who represented the Provincial Grand Master so ably, and to the Lodges for the courteous and friendly manner in which his Representatives were received.

Membership.

The Membership at the end of 2016 was 1233. At the end of 2018, it had fallen to 1182. This year we have lost a net total of 46 memberships. This decrease represents a further decrease of 3.89% over the last year; and a total decrease of 7.89% over the last 3 years. If we consider that over the 3 year period, 70 Brethren have passed to the "Grand Lodge Above", and we had 160 resignations, then clearly, 'resignations' is still a major issue. All resignations are followed up by contact from either the Deputy or the Assistant PGM, and it is imperative that details of all resignations are sent to Province as soon as Lodge Secretaries are informed of them – a follow-up phone call is useless several weeks later.

R W Provincial Grand Master and Brethren

I am pleased to present and submit for adoption the Audited Accounts of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham for the Year Ended 31st December 2019.

The Income and Expenditure Account shows a deficit for the year of £1,488.

As always, the principle items of income continue to be Lodge Dues and Fees of Honour.

Expenditure continues to be monitored regularly.

As mentioned in previous Reports to you, increases in expenditure are planned over the next few years as we continue to replace or refurbish Provincial Grand Mark Lodge Regalia and Furniture as required.

Brethren, once again we are indebted to the Provincial Grand Master and his Provincial Grand Officers who, in carrying out their duties continue to finance their attendance on official deputations to Lodges both within and beyond the Province during the year. The cost to Provincial Grand Mark Lodge, would be considerable if that were not the case, and we are grateful to those Brethren for their continued support and generosity.

So far as the Balance Sheet is concerned, the Accumulated Fund shows a balance of £28,137 at the 31st December 2019, with the Special Reserve Fund standing at £5,178. Brethren the 2020 Centenary Fund which was established in 2015 shows a balance of £41,666 thanks mainly to generous contributions from Lodges and Individual members. All surplus funds continue to be invested in an Investment Account with our Bankers.

In accordance with the 'Notice of Motion' given at the Annual Meeting of Provincial Grand Lodge held on 26^{th} June 2019, I propose that with effect from 1^{st} January 2021 the Mark Annual Dues per member be increased from £3.50 to £4.50, and the Royal Ark Mariner Dues per Lodge be increased from £5.00 to £10.00.

I give 'Notice of Motion' that at the next Annual Meeting of Provincial Grand Lodge, I will propose that the level of Provincial Dues be reviewed.

In conclusion R W Provincial Grand Master and Brethren, I would like to record my thanks to the Lodges who continue to forward dues so promptly, the Provincial Grand Secretary, his Deputy, and Assistant, for their most valuable assistance and cooperation during the year.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

PROVINCIAL GRAND LODGE OF MARK MASTER MASONS OF DURHAM

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham for the year ended 31 December 2019 which comprise of income and expenditure account, balance sheet and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and FRS 102 Section 1A, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

This report is made solely to the members as a body, in accordance with the Lodge's constitution and by-laws. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditors' report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the members and the members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the Lodge's affairs as at 31 December 2019 and of its income and expenditure for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice applicable to Smaller Entities.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) (ISAs (UK)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. REPORT OF THE BENEVOLENT COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDED

31ST DECEMBER 2019

This has been a busy year for our Benevolent Fund with total expenditure of £21,600 of which £20,200 was in the form of charitable grants. Income was slightly down on last year due to Lodge donations being mostly directed towards the separately administered Centenary Fund. The return on our stock market investments of 5.8% is now our most important source of income and it is pleasing to note that the appreciation in value of those investments totalled £39,600 compared to a loss of £36,600 in the previous year.

The dominant feature of our other fund raising activity was again the Gala Dinner when the Co-ordinating Committee organise a most enjoyable evening which consistently produces a donation of £3,500 to the Benevolent Fund. We thank them and all those who regularly attend for their magnificent support. As ever, we also give special thanks to Jim Stubbings for his regalia sales income; John and Marion Scott whose basket raffles have become a significant part of our income and all those brethren who so generously donate privately and through the Gift Aid envelopes distributed at the Annual General Meetings.

Our main charitable giving this year has included the following:

Provincial Grand Lodge of Kent £6,000

Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham

2021 Craft Festival (7th of 9) £2,500

Integrating Children £1,000

Useful Vision £1,000

Provincial Grand Lodge of Lincoln

for flood relief £2,000

And many smaller grants to worthy causes.

The bulk of our investments are held in an Investment Trust designed especially for the charity sector and have provided income this year of £13,896 and an unrealised gain in market value of £39,622.

Overall, our total funds have increased this year by £41,335 to £400,575 at 31st December, 2019.

It is proposed to make the following donations:

The Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham

2021 Craft Festival (8th of 9) £2,500

Mark Benevolent Fund £10,000

and to further to mark our Centenary year in 2020 a total sum of £64,000 to allow every Mark and Royal Ark Mariner Lodge in the Province to make a donation of £1,000 to a charity, group or organisation of their choice, for the benefit of young people, which will be partially offset by a contribution from the Centenary Fund of £30,000.

In these difficult times the Province of Durham Mark Benevolent Fund continues to relieve distress and to support the local community and we thank all our Benevolent Representatives, Almoners, Liaison Officers and Caring Committee members for their assistance and guidance in our work.
