1. Opening of Provincial Grand Lodge

Provincial Grand Lodge was opened in due form and with solemn prayer at 2-55pm.

2. Representatives of the Royal Ark Mariner Lodges

The Representatives of the 22 Royal Ark Mariner Lodges paraded into Provincial Grand Lodge, forming the traditional triangle. The Representative of Rockcliffe RAM Lodge No. 362, W.Bro. J. Gollagly, addressed the Provincial Grand Master, giving their Pledge of Allegiance. The PGM acknowledged their presence, and welcomed them to join him in this Provincial Grand Lodge.

3. Obituary

The R.W. Provincial Grand Master then called upon W. Bro. Ronald Trevor Lynn P.G.J.D. Asst.P.G.M., to announce the Obituary. W.Bro. Lynn read the list of the 30 Brethren who had passed to the Grand Lodge Above since the previous annual meeting in 2021. 7. Roll of Provincial Grand Officers

The Provincial Grand Secretary announced that all of the Current Acting Provincial Grand Officers were present, with the exception of 4, who had all tendered apologies for good reasons.

8. Roll of Mark Lodges

The Provincial Grand Secretary announced that all of the 40 Mark Lodges in the Province were represented at the Meeting, and that satisfactory reports had been received from each of them.

9. Provincial Grand Secretary's Report

The Provincial Grand Secretary's Report had been circulated via Lodge Secretaries, and had been published on the Provincial Website. (Copy of the Report printed below).

The Deputy Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. D.N. Hanson P.G.S.D. proposed, and the Assistant Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. R.T. Lynn P.G.J.D. seconded the proposition, that the Provincial Grand Secretary's Report be taken as read and accepted. This proposal was carried.

10. Provincial Grand Treasurer's Report

The Provincial Grand Treasurer's Report had been circulated via Lodge Secretaries, and had been published on the Provincial Website. (Copy of the Report, and the accompanying financial statements printed below).

The Deputy Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. G. Wharton P.A.G.D.C. proposed, and the Assistant Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. D. Quickmire P.G.J.D. seconded the proposition, that the Treasurer's Report and Statement of Accounts be received, adopted, and that the thanks of Provincial Grand Lodge be accorded to the Treasurer and to the Auditors for their services. This proposal was carried.

The Provincial Grand Treasurer then proposed the Provincial By-Law 12 be altered to replace the words "a firm of Auditors" with the words "Independent Examiners" for the year 2023 onwards. This proposal was seconded by the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, and carried.

Finally, following the Notice of Motion given at last year's annual meeting, the Provincial Grand Treasurer proposed that Provincial Dues be increased from £4-50 per member to £5-00 per member for Mark Lodges, and from £5 per RAM Lodge to £20 per RAM Lodge. This proposal was also carried.

11. Report of Benevolent Committee

The Minutes of the Benevolent Committee Meeting held on Wednesday, 20th April 2022, and accompanying Accounts, had been circulated via Lodge Secretaries, and had been published on the Provincial Website. Therefore, W.Bro. D.N. Hanson P.G.S.D., Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Chairman of the Benevolent Committee, read out his Report of the year 2021. He commended it to the Brethren for adoption, which was duly done. (See accompanying Report and Accounts below). The recommendations which had been made by the Benevolent Committee, and which were contained within the Report, were thus accepted by the assembled Brethren.

Donations:

The Provincial Grand Master, R.W. Bro. Prof. Denovan Keith Wilson, then presented a cheque for £6,000 to R.W. Bro. J. Steggles (West Yorkshire) towards the 2022 M.B.F. Festival. R.W. Bro. Steggles thanked the Provincial Grand Master, and the Mark Master Masons of Durham, for their generosity.

2029 Festival:

The Provincial Grand Master then referred to the M.B.F. 2029 which is to be hosted by the Province of Durham and asked W.Bro. D.N. Hanson P.G.S.D., Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Chairman of the Festival Committee, to give his report as to what had taken place so far. He confirmed that the 2029 Festival would be launched in early 2023, and ran through the names of those he had selected to form the Festival Committee. He also referred to the continuous giving forms on the chairs of attendees.

12. Election of Treasurer

There being only one nomination received for the office of Provincial Grand Treasurer, the Provincial Grand Master declared W.Bro. Graham John Mitchinson P.G.J.D., Past Master of Percy Lodge No. 122, duly elected.

13. Election of Auditors

The Deputy Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. G. Wharton P.A.G.D.C. proposed, and the Assistant Provincial Grand Secretary, W.Bro. D. Quickmire seconded the proposition, that Torgersens Chartered Accountants, of Somerford Buildings, Norfolk Street, Sunderland be elected Auditors for the ensuing year. This proposal was carried.

14. Reappointment of Deputy Provincial Grand Master.

The Provincial Grand Master reappointed W. Bro. David Nigel Hanson P.G.S.D. as Deputy Provincial Grand Master for the ensuing year.

15. Reappointment of Assistant Provincial Grand Master.

The Provincial Grand Master reappointed W.Bro. Ronald Trevor Lynn P.G.J.D. as Assistant Provincial Grand Master for the ensuing year.

16. Appointment of Officers

The Provincial Grand Master then proceeded with the Investiture of Provincial Officers. (See accompanying list below). Salutations to the newly appointed officers were conducted by V.W. Bro. M. Davis, Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies.

17. Provincial Grand Master's Address

The Provincial Grand Master then addressed the Meeting.

At the end of his Address, the Provincial Grand Master asked the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies to present W.Bro. T.J. Sheehan, Worshipful Master of Ferryhill Lodge No. 1560. The Provincial Grand Master then presented the Travelling Gavel to Ferryhill Lodge, charging them to hold it until such times as a Visiting Lodge was able to wrest it from them.

18. Collection

A collection was taken for the Mark Benevolent Fund, which when enhanced by Gift Aid Tax relief, gave a total amount of £1,661-95.

19. Any other business

The Provincial Grand Master confirmed that his co-opted member onto the Finance and General Purposes Committee was V.W. Bro. Frank Alexander Rankin P.G.M.O. He then confirmed that next year's meeting of Provincial Grand Lodge would be held on Wednesday, 28th June 2023. The Provincial Grand Secretary then thanked all Lodge Secretaries, Lodge Scribes, and the many members who had contacted him during his recent illness, and thanked them for their kind wishes. He then went on to pay tribute to the Deputy Provincial Grand Secretary who had so ably stood in for him during this time, and had taken so much of the workload off his shoulders.

20. Vote of Thanks

W.Bro. Ronald Trevor Lynn P.G.J.D., Assistant Provincial Grand Master, gave the Vote of Thanks, in which he thanked the members of the Secretariat, the members of the DC's Team, and all the volunteers who had turned up early to help, for their hard work and commitment to making the day a success.

21. Closing of Provincial Grand Lodge

Provincial Grand Lodge was then closed in due form and with solemn prayer at 4-52pm. The Brethren joined in singing the first verse of the National Anthem.

Report of the Provincial Grand Secretary to the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham

Brethren, I present my fourth Report to the Mark Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham. As you will see from the items listed below, the return to Masonic Meetings as of September 2021 has been very full and enjoyable, with a variety of Provincial Visits arranged. The Pandemic, although in no way over, is at least now allowing us to reconvene in our Lodges, and get back to what Mark Masons do best – have fun and enjoy ourselves. I can say that the general administration of the Province has continued to the normal set deadlines, and I rely on the various Lodge Secretaries to assist me in those matters, and I look forward to seeing you all again in the future.

On a personal level, as you all know by now, the last few months have not been easy with my cancer diagnosis coming as a sudden and complete shock, and the sudden upheaval caused to my lifestyle. Congratulations are extended to all the above, with the wish that they have good health to enjoy their preferment, and the determination to continue to work hard for the betterment of the Order.

Membership (all figures are taken as at 31st December 2021)

The Membership at the end of 2016 was 1233. Last year (2020), it had fallen to 1092. This year we have lost a net total of 62 memberships. This decrease represents a further decrease of 5.68% over the last year; and a total decrease of 16.22% over the last 5 years. If we consider that over the 5 year period, 126 Brethren have passed to the "Grand Lodge Above", and we had 242 resignations, and we have had Covid to deal with, then clearly, 'resignations' are still a major issue. All resignations are followed up by contact from either the Deputy or

the Assistant P.G.M., and it is imperative that details of all intended resignations are sent to Province as soon as Lodge Secretaries are informed of them – a follow-up phone call is useless several weeks later. The one real shaft of light at the end of the tunnel is that, due to Covid, we have had hardly any new members advanced into the Order. Now that we are back to full meeting lists, these new members are now beginning to come through. It is up to you, Brethren, to ensure that it continues.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

PROVINCIAL GRAND LODGE OF MARK MASTER MASONS OF DURHAM

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham for the year ended 31 December 2021 which comprise of income and expenditure account, balance sheet and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and FRS 102 Section 1A, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the Lodge's affairs as at 31 December 2021 and of its income and expenditure for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice applicable to Smaller Entities.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) (ISAs (UK)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the Lodge in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in the UK, including the FRC's Ethical Standard, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Conclusions relating to going concern

In auditing the financial statements, we have concluded that the trustees' use of the going concern basis of accounting in the preparation of the financial statements is appropriate.

Based on the work we have performed, we have not identified any material uncertainties relating to events or conditions that, individually or collectively, may cast significant doubt on the entity's ability to continue as a going concern for a period of at least twelve months from when the financial statements are authorised for issue.

Our responsibilities and the responsibilities of the trustees with respect to going concern are described in the relevant sections of this report.

Other information

Our responsibilities do not extend to any other information.

Matters on which we are required to report by exception

In the light of the knowledge and understanding of the Lodge and its environment obtained in the course of the audit, we have not identified material misstatements in the members' report.

We have nothing to report in respect of the following matters:

- adequate accounting records have not been kept, or returns adequate for our audit have not been received from branches not visited by us; or
- the financial statements are not in agreement with the accounting records and returns; or

- we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit; or
- the members were not entitled to prepare the financial statements in accordance with the small entities regime; or
- a satisfactory system of control over transactions has not been maintained.

Responsibilities of members

The members are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view, and for such internal control as the members determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the members are responsible for assessing the Lodge's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the members either intend to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs (UK) will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Irregularities, including fraud, are instances of non-compliance with laws and regulations. We design procedures in line with our responsibilities, outlined above, to detect material misstatements in respect of irregularities, including fraud. The extent to which our procedures are capable of detecting irregularities including fraud is detailed below:

Explanation as to what extent the audit was considered capable of detecting irregularities, including fraud

The objectives of our audit with regards to fraud are to design tailored and specific audit procedures to enable us to gather sufficient audit evidence. These tests are proportionate and appropriate to the Lodge in terms of assessed risk level and the nature of the entity's activities. However, the primary responsibility for the prevention and detection of fraud rests with those charged with governance.

- We obtained an understanding of the legal and regulatory requirements which applied to the Lodge, which we deemed to be the Lodge's Constitution and Bye-laws and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective January 2015.)
- We obtained an understanding of how the Lodge had complied with these regulations by reviewing their treatment of transactions, reviewing minutes of meetings and discussing compliance with members.
- The risk of material misstatement of the financial statements due to fraud or error was assessed, and we deemed the entity to be low risk. The Lodge's Treasurer, who is deemed to have sufficient knowledge, works closely with the members who approve all transactions. We considered how fraud may occur within the financial statements and identified that the receipt of lodge dues and income from ties and tokens were susceptible to fraud or error. We designed our audit work to test the controls in place regarding the processing of these transactions and how these controls are capable of preventing or detecting fraud or error.
- Our audit procedures gathered evidence to support the claims of the members whilst maintaining professional scepticism to allow us to draw our own conclusion on the matter.

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs (UK), we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

• Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the members.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the members' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Lodge's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

REPORT OF THE BENEVOLENT COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER 2021

As we move into a period of preparation for our 2029 Festival, due to be launched in January 2023, I am pleased to report that the finances of the Durham Mark Benevolent Fund for the year to 31st December 2021 show a considerably improved position compared to the previous year. The country is slowly recovering from the pandemic and the various lockdowns and whilst 2020 was a year to remember as our Centenary Year, with grants of £1,000 to each of 64 charities and organisations supporting young people, it was a year to forget for the £48k loss in the value of our investments.

Donations by Lodges, which was formerly our primary source of income, was slightly up at £2,536 but well down on levels seen in recent years. We recognise and accept that for the next few years there will be little improvement in this position as the Festival inevitably takes precedence. A donation of £4,000 was received from the Centenary Fund at the request of the Durham Mark Executive to compensate for the loss of income after the cancellation of the annual Gala Dinner together with its associated Money Draw. Other voluntary contributions to our Fund consisted of generous donations from caring brethren, including several from the families of those who have recently departed. Again we make special mention of John Scott's widow Marion who continued John's great support by choosing to donate his funeral collection of £170 to the Benevolent Fund. With a mixture of gratitude and sadness we also thank the brethren of Shipley Lodge for the donation of their closure funds totalling £246.

Our major source of income now comes in the form of dividends on our investments which this year totalled £12,492 representing a return of over 5%. This of course is largely due to the legacy of the late R W Bro J Harold Easton and it is a timely moment to express our great appreciation for his gesture which has enabled us to continue our charitable activities in spite of falling revenues.

Our main charitable giving this year has included:

Province of Surrey £6,000

Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham £2,500 (2021 Craft Festival 9th of 9)

Mark Benevolent Fund £10,000 (brought forward from 2020 re Centenary)

Gateshead Hospice at Home £1,000

Deptford and Millfield Community Centre) £1,000

and several smaller grants to worthy causes.

The bulk of our investments is held in an Investment Trust designed especially for the charity sector and has provided income this year of £12,492 and a welcome gain in market value of £30,742.

Overall, our total funds have increased this year by £27,452 to £345,580 at 31st December 2021.

It is proposed to make the following donations:

The Province of West Yorkshire £6,000

The Mark Benevolent Fund £2,000 (Ukraine Appeal)

As freemasonry in general recovers from the trauma of the pandemic, the Durham Mark Benevolent Fund has continued to relieve distress, both at home and abroad, and to support the local community and we thank all our Benevolent Representatives, Almoners, Liaison Officers and Caring Committee members for their assistance and guidance in our work.

Brethren, I commend this Report to you.
