1. Opening of Provincial Grand Lodge

Provincial Grand Lodge was opened in due form and with solemn prayer at 3-15pm.

1a. Representatives of the Royal Ark Mariner Lodges

The Representatives of the 22 Royal Ark Mariner Lodges paraded into Provincial Grand Lodge, forming the traditional triangle. The Representative of Eclectic RAM Lodge No. 39, W Bro A. Ruddell, addressed the Provincial Grand Master, giving their Pledge of Allegiance. The PGM acknowledged their presence, and welcomed them to join him in this Provincial Grand Lodge.

2. Salutations

Appropriate Salutations & Proclamations were conducted by the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies, V W Bro A. Craven PGJO.

3. Obituary

The R W Provincial Grand Master then called upon W Bro Keith Dinning, the Provincial Grand Chaplain to announce the Obituary. W Bro Dinning stated that since the previous AGM, 32 Durham Brethren had passed to the Grand Lodge above, and all 32 were named. He then called the assembled Brethren to order to receive a prayer.

7. Roll of Provincial Grand Officers

9. Provincial Grand Secretary's Report

The Provincial Grand Secretary presented the following report. (See accompanying report).

10. Provincial Grand Treasurer's Report

The Provincial Grand Treasurer read his Report and presented the following Statement of Accounts. (See accompanying financial statements).

W Bro M.I. Hamilton, Worshipful Master, Harte Lodge No. 740, proposed, and W Bro J. Higginbottom, Worshipful Master, Unity Lodge No. 827, seconded the proposition that the Treasurer's Report and Statement of Accounts be received, and adopted, and that the thanks of Provincial Grand Lodge be accorded to the Treasurer and to the Auditors for their services. This proposal was carried.

11. General Purposes Committee Report

A meeting of the General Purposes Committee was held in the Lancastrian Suite, Lancaster Road, Dunston, on Wednesday, 27th June 2018 at 2.00 p.m., when the Provincial Grand Master, R W Bro Prof. D K Wilson presided.

The Minutes of the Meeting held at Dunston on 28th June 2017, having been presented, were taken as read, confirmed, and signed as a correct record. The Provincial Grand Treasurer, W Bro G. J. Mitchinson, PGJD, presented the Statement of Accounts which had been previously circulated. The Accounts were received and recommended for adoption by Provincial Grand Lodge, and thanks were recorded to the Treasurer.

W Bro C.G. Richardson, Worshipful Master Moseley Lodge No. 925, proposed, and W Bro J.W. Lonsdale, Worshipful Master Walton Lodge No. 1106, seconded the proposition that the Report be received, adopted, and that the recommendations contained therein be approved. The proposal was carried.

12. Report of Benevolent Committee

W Bro D.N. Hanson PAGDC, Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Chairman of the Benevolent Committee, presented the Report. (See accompanying report and balance sheet).

The recommendations which had been made by the Benevolent Committee and which were contained within the Report were put for approval, and accepted by the assembled Brethren.

Donations

The Provincial Grand Master, R W Bro Prof. Denovan Keith Wilson stated that a donation of £6,000 towards the MBF Festival for 2019 had been sent to the Province of Sussex. R W Bro C.M. Wilson, PGM for Sussex, acknowledged receipt of this money, and thanked the Provincial Grand Master for the generous donation, stating that he hoped to see a good number of Durham Brethren in Brighton next year.

The Provincial Grand Master, R W Bro Prof. Denovan Keith Wilson, then presented a cheque for £2,500 to R W Bro N.E. Heaviside (PGM Craft) towards the 2021 Craft Festival, this being the 6th of 9 donations. R W Bro Heaviside thanked the Provincial Grand Master, and the Mark Master Masons of Durham, for their continued generosity.

The Provincial Grand Master, R W Bro Prof. Denovan Keith Wilson, then requested the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies to present W Bro Joseph Alan Hind PGSD to him. W Bro Hind was then presented with his Diamond Patron collarette and jewel to mark his continued donations to the Mark Benevolent Fund.

13. Nomination of Representatives

14. Election of Treasurer

This proposal was carried.

16. Reappointment of Deputy Provincial Grand Master.

The Provincial Grand Master reappointed W Bro David Nigel Hanson PAGDC as Deputy Provincial Grand Master for the ensuing year.

17. Reappointment of Assistant Provincial Grand Master.

The Provincial Grand Master reappointed W Bro Ronald Trevor Lynn PAGDC as Assistant Provincial Grand Master for the ensuing year.

18. Appointment of Officers

The Provincial Grand Master then proceeded with the Investiture of Provincial Officers. (See accompanying list). Salutations to the newly appointed officers were conducted by W Bro M Davis, Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies.

19. Provincial Grand Master's Address

The Provincial Grand Master then addressed the Meeting.

At the end of his Address, the Provincial Grand Master explained the introduction of a 'Travelling Gavel' for the Province, and asked the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies to present W Bro Alan Ruddell, and W Bro William James Bell, Worshipful Master of St Andrew's Lodge No. 854, to him. W Bro Ruddell had been responsible for the designing and making of the 'Travelling Gavel', and duly presented it to the Provincial Grand Master as a gift to the Province. The Provincial Grand Master thanked W Bro Ruddell for his efforts, praising his skill and craftsmanship, and then asked him to present it to W Bro Bell, as St Andrew's Lodge had been selected by ballot as the first recipients.

20. Invitation

The Provincial Grand Master received and accepted an invitation from W Bro W.J. Bell, Worshipful Master of St. Andrew's Lodge No. 854, to hold the 2019 Annual Meeting under the banners of St. Andrew's Lodge No. 854, Elevation Lodge No. 1112, St. Aidan Lodge No. 1145, and Ryton Lodge No. 1714, on Wednesday, 26th June 2019 at The Lancastrian Suite, Dunston.

21. Collection

A collection was taken for the Mark Benevolent Fund, which when enhanced by Gift Aid Tax relief, gave a total amount of £1,842-15.

22. Address by the St. John Ambulance Service

Provincial Grand Lodge was then "Called Off". The Tyler admitted Dr. Gillian Willmore (Chair of the Durham County Priory Group), and Mr. Graham Ellis (Training Delivery Manager, St. John Ambulance Service). Dr. Willmore was invited to address Provincial Grand Lodge. In her Address, she thanked all Mark Master Masons for their continued and generous support for the St. John Ambulance Service, and went on to explain how our latest donation of £3.3m had come at just the right time due to cut-backs in their funding from the NHS. Mr Ellis then addressed the assembled Brethren. Again, he thanked all Mark Masons for their support, and briefly outlined his role in the Service. The Provincial Grand Master then presented a cheque for £500 to Dr. Willmore which was to be used towards the maintenance and upkeep of the Small Treatment Centre which the Durham branch of St. John Ambulance Service had received in January. Dr. Willmore and Mr. Ellis then retired from Provincial Grand Lodge. Provincial Grand Lodge was "Called On". Later in the day, V W Bro R.N. Neville PGJO, Provincial Charity Steward, presented a cheque for £100 to the two St. John Ambulance Service Officers who were on duty throughout our Provincial Meeting.

23. Vote of Thanks

W Bro Ronald Trevor Lynn APGM gave the Vote of Thanks, in which he thanked the Host Lodges, the Grand Stewards' Lodge, the members of the Secretariat, and the members of the DC's Team for their hard work and commitment to making the day a success.

24. Any other business

The Provincial Grand Secretary gave Notice of Motion that proposals for changes to the By-Laws of the General Purposes Committee will be brought before the next Annual General Meeting of Provincial Grand Lodge.

He then stated that he had no other business to bring before Provincial Grand Lodge.

25. Closing of Provincial Grand Lodge

Provincial Grand Lodge was then closed in due form at 5.37pm and with solemn prayer. The Brethren joined in singing the Closing Ode and the first verse of the National Anthem.

The exit procession was formed by W Bro M Davis, Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies, during which the Provincial Grand Master invited V W Bro Anthony Craven to accompany him in the procession

Report of the Provincial Grand Secretary to the Provincial Grand Lodge held in the Lancastrian Suite, Lancaster Road, Dunston, Gateshead NE11 9JR on Wednesday, 27th June 2018.

I present my Second Report to the Provincial Grand Mark Lodge of Durham. Since my appointment as Provincial Grand Secretary on 6th December 2016 it has been a very busy but enjoyable eighteen months. Our Provincial Grand Master now presides over his fourth Mark Annual Meeting and has continued to lead the Province with many new initiatives, and has made further changes to his Executive Team. It has been another busy year for the Mark Provincial Team, with 22 visits made during the year.

At our last Annual Meeting on 28th June 2017, following the retirement of VW Bro Stuart Andrew Raymond Ingram, PGJO, W Bro David Nigel Hanson, AGDC, was installed as Assistant Provincial Grand Master.

This Especial Meeting held at Durham was a splendid formal occasion attended by 105 Brethren, who shortly after the closing of Provincial Grand Lodge, attended Dunelm Mark Lodge No 356 on a Provincial Visit, to round off a truly memorable evening. My sincere thanks go to Dunelm Mark Lodge and the Durham Masonic Hall Management Team for being such great Hosts for the evening.

Membership

The Membership at the end of 2016 was 1233 and by the end of 2017 had fallen to 1218. This decrease in Membership of 15 represents 1.2% of the Membership.

If we consider that 18 Brethren passed to the "Grand Lodge Above", and we had 51 resignations, then clearly resignations is an issue which needs to be and is already being addressed. The launch of "Four Steps to the Mark" earlier this year should ensure that recruitment will continue to be given high priority.

I am pleased to present and submit for adoption the Audited Accounts of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Durham for the Year Ended 31st December 2017.

After making a provision of £500.00 to the Special Reserve Fund, the Income and Expenditure Account shows a surplus for the year of £3,022.

You will remember Brethren, that the Special Reserve Fund was setup as a provision towards the Installation of a Provincial Grand Master.

As always, the principle items of income continue to be Lodge Dues and Fees of Honour, with the Annual Meeting Dues being offset against the Annual Meeting Expenditure.

Expenditure continues to be monitored regularly.

As mentioned in previous Reports to you, increases in expenditure are planned over the next few years as we continue to replace or refurbish Provincial Grand Mark Lodge Regalia and Furniture as required. In addition, the contributions set aside for the Special Reserve Fund will continue to be reviewed annually.

REPORT OF THE BENEVOLENT COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2017

The Benevolent Committee is continuing to deliver on its promise to establish a solid foundation for our Benevolent Fund following the exceptional legacy of £454K bequeathed by R. W. Bro. John Harold Easton in 2016. The decision to donate £169K to the Mark Benevolent Fund and thereby attain Grand Patron Gold status for the Province of Durham and every Mark and Royal Ark Mariner Lodge under its jurisdiction, has shed a very favourable light on our charitable activities and has ensured that our province is in the forefront of support for our national charity. The current year has been rather less dramatic but nevertheless has seen an increase in income, an increase in other charitable giving and an unrealised gain on our investments.

The Gala Dinner is now firmly established as a highlight of the Fund's social calendar as well as incorporating the Money Draw and contributing £3,500 to our funds. We thank the Co-ordinating Committee for all their efforts in making this major donation whilst at the same time providing a fun evening enjoyed by all. The lodge donations to the 2020 Centenary Fund have had the understandable effect of reducing lodge donations to the Benevolent Fund but it is hoped that this situation will revert to normal in due course. A special mention this year goes to W. Bro. Jim Stubbings for raising £630 from Regalia Sales, the John and Marion Scott raffles which contributed an extraordinary £970, a surprise bequest of £3,000 from the estate of W. Bro. Frank Owen, and all the brethren who make a donation by way of the gift aid envelopes.
