Report of the Provincial Grand Secretary to Provincial Grand Lodge at the Lancastrian Suite, Lancaster Road, Dunston, Gateshead NE11 9JR held on Wednesday, 26<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

I present my first Report to the Provincial Grand Mark Lodge of Durham. The last 13 months have been extremely busy, as you will see from the items listed below. However, the next 18 months promise to be even more hectic, enjoyable, and exciting. Our Provincial Grand Master now presides over his fifth Mark Annual Meeting, and has continued to lead the Province with many new initiatives. It has been another busy year for the Mark Provincial Team, with 15 visits made during the year. While the appointments made in May and June of 2018, are now bedded in, and the work required of the new roles is slowly being learned.

### Lodge Visits (15).

The Provincial Grand Master appreciates the support from his Active Team of Provincial Officers which has enabled him to accept Provincial Deputation Visits to the following Mark Lodges: Eclectic 39; Percy 122; Union 124; Industry 293; Dunelm 356; Auckland 596; Hackworth 761; Clavering 896; William Todd 929; Spennymoor 981; Staindrop 1274; Durham Lodge of Installed Mark Masters 1492; Ferryhill 1560; Ryton 1714; and Indaba 1936.

## Lodge of Instruction.

The Annual Festival of the Durham Mark Lodge of Instruction will be held at Shiney Row on Tuesday, 29<sup>th</sup> October 2019, where V W Bro. Paul Philip Paterson PGMO will preside as President of the Festival.

### 50 Year Certificates.

During the last year, only 1 Certificate celebrating 50 years' membership of the Order was presented to: W Bro Gordon Fletcher, Ferryhill Mark Lodge No. 1560.

## Installations.

The Provincial Grand Master was represented at all the Mark Lodge Installation Meetings and the reports of those representing indicated that the Ceremonies were, as usual, of a high standard and well conducted in the majority of cases. Thanks are extended to all those Brethren who represented the Provincial Grand Master so ably, and to the Lodges for the courteous and friendly manner in which the representatives were received.

## Membership.

The Membership at the end of 2016 was 1233 and by the end of 2017 had fallen to 1218. At the end of 2018, it had fallen again to 1180. This decrease in Membership of 38 represents a further decrease of 3.12% over the last year; and a total decrease of 4.32% over the last 2 years. If we consider that over the 2 year period, 50 Brethren have passed to the "Grand Lodge Above", and we had 95 resignations, then clearly, 'resignations' is a major issue. All resignations are followed up by contact from either the Deputy or the Assistant PGM, and it is imperative that details of all resignations are sent to Province as soon as Lodge Secretaries are informed of them – a follow-up phone call is useless several weeks later. Hopefully, the launch of the re-vamped and improved "Fourth Step to the Mark" earlier this year should ensure that recruitment will continue to be given high priority.
